# To disband (verb)

## Definition:

1. (With reference to an organised group) break up or cause to break up.

## Synonyms:

1. Break up, disperse, demobilise, dissolve, scatter.

## Discussion Task:

2. What is the difference between disbanding a group and a group being disbanded?

5. If a group is disbanded by someone else, how might they feel?

## Example:
