We take pastoral care very seriously at Ash Hill Academy, and we work tirelessly to make sure our students are happy and settled with no barriers to what they can achieve.

Each of our students attend a weekly year group assembly and meet within a tutor group on a daily basis. All available time is structured into learning opportunities and form groups are utilised to teach students all aspects of safety and wellbeing. Our students have collaborative learning opportunities in all subjects so that they benefit from each other's experiences and gain invaluable insights into working as a team.

We use a tried and tested student support system in which non-teaching staff focus on how each individual is progressing through the school, and step in if their help is needed. Each year group has a dedicated Learning Manager who is there to deal with any other issues our students may encounter, in or outside of school. We have other pastoral staff responsible for helping students with areas such as attendance and welfare, and we also have close working links with several external agencies.

Parents are able to develop strong relationships with their child's Form Tutor and Learning Manager. Furthermore, they have opportunities to meet with all their child's subject teachers at regular Parents' Evenings.

In essence, Ash Hill Academy's vision and values underpin everything we are striving to achieve on a daily basis for all staff, students and the wider community.

BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

We have a very clear, rigorous and fair approach to instilling the highest conceivable standards of behaviour for learning at Ash Hill Academy.

This serves to guarantee the best possible learning experiences and subsequent life chances available to our young people. Clear Delta Academies Trust policies and practice empowers us to ensure our students learn in lessons with clear learning objectives, challenging, well-paced and engaging activities, supported with highly, aspirational learning outcomes.

The Academy has high expectations and any student failing to fully focus their efforts will receive sanctions accordingly. This ensures that any disruptions to learning are swiftly addressed, teaching students to develop the self-discipline required to be successful throughout life.

Our Behaviour Policy is fully transparent with the aim to create a harmonious Academy culture that holds in high regard, effort, consideration and self-awareness, in collaboration with key stakeholders. We believe that developing effective working relationships is essential in underpinning our fundamental core values.

We share this with students in a way that enables them to act positively and to help them understand how their actions can directly affect others as well as themselves, developing a sense of personal responsibility.

As an Academy, the emphasis on students having their planners available at all times is paramount. The student planner is integral to learning within lessons and also provides parents with a full overview of their child's daily activities, rewards, homework and behaviour aspects.

Throughout the year we regularly reward effort via positive praise assemblies with certificates and prizes. This emphasises that our educational vision is about the recognition and rewarding of students above all else for trying their best throughout the whole academic year.

TRANSITION

The transition from primary to secondary school is the most important stage of your child's education to date. The structure of their day changes massively going from one teacher a day to a different teacher for each subject and moving round the Academy to get to their next lesson. The Academy is also much bigger than what they may be used to, which can be quite daunting in itself.

At Ash Hill Academy we work extremely hard in partnership with our primary feeder schools to make the transition process as smooth as possible. Our transition process begins early in the autumn term with some of our departments, for example Science working with our primary schools supporting them with aspects of the Year 6 curriculum. We hold our first transition event in October, inviting Year 5 and 6 students and their families to look round Ash Hill Academy. This introduces the students to the Academy and allows them to start preparing for the move from primary to secondary school.

Our family focus events welcome students and their families into the Academy to take part in a range of exciting opportunities. We feel that this gives our next year group of students a real chance to engage with Academy staff and students, to help them make the smoothest of transitions from primary to us.

Over the winter months a huge amount of work takes place behind the scenes as we and our primary colleagues work closely to share information about students who are moving up to the Academy, this allows us to ensure everything is in place ready for the start of Year 7 including appropriate support for SEND and vulnerable students.

In the Summer term we visit Year 6 students in their primary setting and speak with the staff at the primary schools to build up a full picture of every student prior to their start with us in Year 7. In addition, all students are invited to a two-day transition event at Ash Hill Academy. During these two days, they will meet key staff such as their Year Leader and Form Tutor.

Students experience a typical day in a secondary school and learn about the expectations and culture at the Academy. There will also be additional transition dedicated to SEND and vulnerable students in which families are invited into the academy to speak with members of the Inclusion and SEND teams to get students prepared to start in the autumn.

This rigorous transition process is complemented with SEND and vulnerable students being invited to the academy to work with key staff.

There is also a Parents' Evening where you are invited to tour the Academy, meet key staff and can ask questions about transition. The final stages of transition will be supported by a range of resources and materials available online to help students prepare for the next exciting stage of their education with us.

CURRICULUM

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum and aim to develop our students in preparation for life in modern Britain. Our curriculum offer is adapted to meet individual needs where appropriate and therefore offers a range of pathways, designed to enable our students to explore and discover their strengths and talents. We have a strong focus on the core curriculum of English, Mathematics, Science, RE, EPC (Ethics, Philosophy and Citizenship), French, Geography and History. In addition, we teach Design Technology, Computing, PE, Dance, Food Technology, Art, Music and Drama.

In Key Stage Four we offer a broad range of technical, vocational and academic subjects including the opportunity to study new subjects such as Health and Social Care, I-Media, Hospitality and Catering, Sports Science and Photography. Everyone has 25 lessons per week, each lasting an hour.





We employ a team of outstanding English and Mathematics tutors to support those who need a little extra help and we also run intervention sessions to develop reading in our library. We have a team of dedicated Teaching Assistants who work with individuals or small groups of students in lessons. There is a strong emphasis on personal development and preparing students for work and life beyond the Academy in the wider community.

We have an extensive tutor time programme when we learn about local and global issues with an underlying focus on improving reading, writing and oracy. We have assembly every week, and welcome visiting speakers into the Academy. Our careers and enterprise education offer is award-winning and we regularly work with visitors from a variety of professional backgrounds.

WORLD CLASS FACILITIES

The new state of the art Sports Centre will open in January 2024

This outstanding facility will feature a state-of-the-art activity studio and sports hall. The new facility will have a low carbon footprint with solar panels and a green living roof to reduce carbon emissions.

Students will use these exceptional facilities during their Physical Education lessons throughout their learning journey at Ash Hill Academy and will be able to access them during the wide range of sports extra-curricular activities on offer.

Following on from the Sports Centre, Ash Hill Academy have plans to build 4G flood lit sports pitches, which will further enhance the sporting facilities on offer for Ash Hill Academy students and it will make the Sports Centre a Sporting Hub for the local community and the surrounding area of Doncaster.





HOME LEARNING

At Ash Hill Academy, we know that completing home learning is essential to long-term academic success. It allows our students to extend their learning and to reinforce what has been learnt in class.

Every day, your child will be expected to study for around one hour. Home learning will be in three 20-minute parts:

- · Knowledge Organisers and quizzing.
- Sparx Maths.
- Reading for pleasure.

In addition to the above students may receive further home learning tasks on platforms such as GCSE Pod and Language Nut. These should be completed in addition to the above.

READING FOR PLEASURE

At Ash Hill Academy, we know that reading is the single most powerful skill that our students will ever acquire. We believes that reading is central to the development of our students and have implemented 'Reading Routes' to encourage as many students as possible to read for pleasure. A key aim of our 'Reading Routes' initiative is to foster a love of reading for leisure and pleasure whilst widening the cultural experiences of our students and ultimately broadening their learning beyond the core curriculum.

As part of the nine main reading routes, students will be exposed to a range of genres:

Comedy central Crime and Mystery History

Adventure Thriller Fantasy

Must Read Classics Humour Mystery



INCLUSION QUAILTY MARK

Ash Hill Academy provides each student with exceptional pastoral and emotional support, together with a relentless focus on ensuring each young person reaches their potential.

At Ash Hill Academy, everybody's voice is heard, encouraged, and valued. Strong relationships are the key to our inclusive school which are developed through the outstanding pastoral support each student receives.

Ash Hill Academy is very proud to be an Inclusion Quality Mark (IQM) Centre of Excellence. The school achieved this award following a rigorous assessment in March 2023.

Only around 240 schools in the UK have met the standard required to become an IQM Centre of Excellence for outstanding practice in inclusion.

The Inclusion Quality Mark provides schools with a nationally recognised framework to guide their inclusion journey. The IQM team help schools evaluate and measure how they are performing, empowering them to improve and develop.

Excellence states that Ash Hill Academy promotes equal opportunities for all pupils, whatever their age, ethnicity, attainment and background. It pays particular attention to the provision made for, and the achievement of, different groups of pupils within the Academy. Inclusion is at the heart of what we do at Ash Hill Academy and the IQM is recognition of the outstanding contribution of all at the school: pupils, parents, staff, trustees and local partners.

ENRICHMENT

At Ash Hill Academy we believe that learning and personal development is not just about what happens in the classroom, we firmly believe that opportunities beyond the classroom also play a critical part in the development and achievements of our students. We have a wide range of enrichment opportunities which broaden horizons, grow essential life skills, build self-confidence and resilience – and the students have fun while being a part of them!

Our Approach

We have developed a new and exciting approach to enrichment at Ash Hill Academy. We have broken down the enrichment opportunities into four unique components.

Contributions – All year groups will have the opportunity to contribute to Academy life in different ways depending on the year group at the are in. This could be through representing the Academy in different roles, such as being part of an academic event, representing the school at a sporting event, being part of one of our enrichment clubs or debate team. Alternatively, it could be being part of a charitable event, presenting or representing the Academy at transition days, or being an anti-bullying ambassador.

Experiences – We strongly believe that students having a plethora of experiences outside of the Academy helps to broaden horizons and enables pupils to view academic content in real-life settings. Therefore, in addition to the many trips that are led by individual subject areas, we offer all students in every year group an opportunity to join us on different excursions. These range from a trip to the theatre and a coastal visit in year 7, numerous residentials in year 8, a visit to London in year 9, an exploration of different venues for further education in year 10 and to experience different cuisines in year 11.





Celebrations - Celebrating students' successes is a vital element of our ethos at Ash Hill Academy. We therefore take time out of each half term to ensure that students are recognised for their efforts and accomplishments. The cumulation of these celebrations can be observed in our annual year 9 Graduation and the celebration of the hard work and achievements in the year 11 Prom.

Enrichment – We are proud to introduce our after-school enrichment package, tailored to allow pupils to best develop their interests and hobbies. Students have access to a wide range of personal development opportunities. Students have half termly opportunities to select which enrichment they would like to be a part of. They can choose to be a part of enrichments such as Ocean Explorers in Geography, Stainforth – This Is Your Life in History, Witchcraft and Wizardry in Science and many more.

In addition to this we also run our all-year-round enrichment opportunities such as 'The Big Band', SING! which is our choir group, Sports Nation where pupils are offered many afterschool sporting opportunities.

Enrichment allows students to create memories that last a lifetime and develop cultural capital to complement their academic achievement. We encourage all students to take part in an enrichment opportunity from our extensive range that we have on offer.
